Circular economy The main three principles required for the transformation to a circular economy are: designing out waste and pollution, keeping products and materials in use, and regenerating natural systems. There are many definitions of the circular economy. The concept aims to tackle global challenges such as climate change, biodiversity loss, waste, and pollution by emphasizing the design-based implementation of the three base principles of the model. CE is defined in contradistinction to the traditional linear economy. For example, in China A circular economy (CE), also referred to as circularity, is a model of resource production and consumption in any economy that involves sharing, leasing, reusing, repairing, refurbishing, and recycling existing materials and products for as long as possible. towards long-life solutions, resulting in the so-called 'circular business models';
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Vilfredo Pareto He made several important contributions to economics, particularly in the study of income distribution and in the analysis of individuals' choices, and was one of the minds behind the Lausanne School of economics. Trained in physics and mathematics, he became a polymath whose genius radiated into nearly all other major fields of knowledge. He was also responsible for popularising the use of the term elite in social analysis and contributed to elite theory. He made several important contributions to
