United States antitrust law The three main U. The Robinson-Patman Act, an amendment to the Clayton Act, prohibits price discrimination. Section 1 of the Sherman Act prohibits price fixing and the operation of cartels, and prohibits other collusive practices that unreasonably restrain trade. S. Section 7 of the Clayton Act restricts the mergers and acquisitions of organizations that may substantially lessen competition or tend to create a monopoly. Section 2 of the Sherman Act prohibits monopolization. Federal statutes ban obscenity and child pornography produced with real children (such child pornography is unprotected

by the First Amendment even when it is not obscene). Federal law also bans broadcasting (but not cable or satellite transmission) of "indecent" material during specified hours. Issues of obscenity arise at federal and state levels. State laws operate only within the jurisdiction of each state, and state laws on obscenity differ.
