Mechanical Turk 'chess Turk'; Hungarian: A Török), or simply The Turk, was a fraudulent chess-playing machine constructed in 1770, which appeared to be able to play a strong game of chess autonomously, but whose pieces were in reality moved via levers and magnets by a chess master hidden in the machine's lower cavity. In 1857, an article published by the owner's son revealed that it was an elaborate hoax; a fact suspected by some but never fully explained while the machine still existed.
