Cold-formed steel, especially in the form of thin gauge sheets, is commonly used in the construction industry for structural or non-structural items such as columns, beams, joists, studs, floor decking, built-up sections and other components. Structural channel Its cross section consists of a wide "web", usually but not always oriented vertically, and two "flanges" at the top and bottom of the web, only sticking out on one side of the web. Flange nut A flange nut is a nut that has a wide flange at one end that acts as an integrated washer. This serves to distribute the pressure of the nut over the part A flange nut is a nut that has a wide flange at one end that acts as an integrated washer. These nuts are mostly hexagonal in shape and are made up of hardened steel and often coated with zinc. This serves to distribute the pressure of the nut over the part being secured, reducing the chance of damage to the part and making it less likely to loosen as a result of an uneven fastening surface 37f1924aaa

Bethlehem Steel From its founding in 1857 through its 2003 dissolution, Bethlehem Steel's headquarters were based in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, in the Lehigh Valley region of eastern Pennsylvania. At the height of its success and productivity, the company was a symbol of American manufacturing leadership in the world, and its decline and ultimate bankruptcy and liquidation in the late 20th century is similarly cited as an example of America's diminished manufacturing leadership during the late 20th century. Its primary steel mill manufacturing facilities were located in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, and. Steel Corporation. Bethlehem Steel Corporation installed the Gray rolling mill and produced the nation's first wide-flange structural shapes, which proved The Bethlehem Steel Corporation was an American steelmaking company headquartered in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Until its closure in 2003, it was one of the world's largest steel-producing and shipbuilding companies 37f1924aaa

Cold-formed steel Stock bars and sheets of cold-rolled steel (CRS) are commonly used in all areas of manufacturing. the American Iron and Steel Institute has also published commentaries on various editions of the specifications, design manuals, framing design standards Cold-formed steel (CFS) is the common term for steel products shaped by cold-working processes carried out near room temperature, such as rolling, pressing, stamping, bending, etc. The terms are opposed to hot-formed steel and hot-rolled steel 37f1924aaa
