There is no standard definition of a metalloid and no complete agreement on which elements are metalloids. The word metalloid comes from the Latin metallum ("metal") and the Greek oeides ("resembling in form or appearance") 51fed0a5e5

Physically, these metals are soft (or brittle), have poor mechanical strength, and usually have melting points lower than those of the transition metals. Being close to the metal-nonmetal border, their crystalline structures tend to show covalent or directional bonding effects, having generally greater complexity or fewer nearest neighbours than other metallic elements. 51fed0a5e5
