The alphabet of a formal language consists of symbols that concatenate into strings (also called "words"). Words that belong to a particular formal language are sometimes called well-formed words. A formal language is often defined by means of a formal grammar such as a regular grammar or context-free grammar. The terminology cone has a French origin. In the American oriented literature one usually speaks of a full trio. The trio corresponds to the faithful cone.

The word automata comes from the Greek word αὐτόματος, which means "self-acting, self-willed, self-moving". This automaton consists of states (represented in the figure by circles) and transitions. An automaton with a finite number of states is called a finite automaton (FA) or finite-state machine (FSM). An automaton (automata in plural) is an abstract self-propelled computing device which follows a predetermined sequence of operations automatically. The figure on the right illustrates a finite-state machine, which is a well-known type of automaton.
