He is one of the major figures associated with post-structuralism and postmodern philosophy although he distanced himself from post-structuralism and disavowed the word "postmodernity". Writing process Some have linked this three-stage process to the five canons of rhetoric: pre-writing to invention A writing process is a set of mental and physical steps that someone takes to create any type of text. Almost always, these activities require inscription equipment, either digital or physical: chisels, pencils, brushes, chalk, dyes, keyboards, touchscreens, etc. ; each of these tools has unique affordances that influence writers' workflows. conceptualize writing processes along these three phases.
