CVDs constitute a class of diseases that includes: coronary artery diseases (e. diseases involving the blood vessels. angina, heart attack), heart failure, hypertensive heart disease, rheumatic heart disease, cardiomyopathy, arrhythmia, congenital heart disease, valvular heart disease, carditis, aortic aneurysms, peripheral artery disease, thromboembolic disease, and venous thrombosis. From the atrium the oxygenated blood enters the left ventricle

where it is pumped out to the rest of the body, then returning as deoxygenated blood back to the pulmonary circulation. The underlying mechanisms vary depending on the disease. It is estimated that dietary risk factors are associated with 53% of CVD deaths. Coronary artery disease, stroke, and peripheral artery disease involve atherosclerosis. This may be caused by high blood pressure, smoking, diabetes mellitus, lack of exercise, obesity, high blood cholesterol, poor diet, excessive...

Cyanosis As soon as pulmonary pressure exceeds aortic pressure, cyanosis is the change of tissue color to a bluish-purple hue, as a result of decrease in the amount of oxygen bound to the hemoglobin in the red blood cells of the capillary bed. Cyanosis is apparent usually in the body tissues covered with thin skin, including the mucous membranes, lips, nail beds, and ear lobes. Appropriate physical examination and history taking is a crucial part to diagnose cyanosis. Some medications may cause discoloration such as medications containing amiodarone or silver. Furthermore, mongolian spots, large birthmarks, and the consumption of food products with blue or purple dyes can also result in the bluish skin tissue discoloration and may be mistaken for cyanosis. In ductus arteriosus, progressive pulmonary vascular disease, and pressure overload of the right ventricle occurs. Management of cyanosis involves treating the main cause, as cyanosis is not a disease, but rather a symptom.

Various laboratory tests (CBC, troponin, BNP, etc.) and imaging studies (chest x-ray, CT scan, ultrasound) are often used to diagnose and classify the cause of pulmonary edema.

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
