Settling basins are ponds constructed for the purpose of removing entrained solids by sedimentation. Concentrations of raceway effluent The physical process of sedimentation (the act of depositing sediment) has applications in water treatment, whereby gravity acts to remove suspended solids from water. Solid particles entrained by the turbulence of moving water may be removed naturally by sedimentation in the still water of lakes and oceans. Clarifiers are tanks built with mechanical means for continuous removal of solids being deposited by sedimentation; however, clarification does not remove dissolved solids d7e194ee65

Vitamin C requirements. As a therapy, it is used to prevent and treat scurvy, a disease caused by vitamin C deficiency. By way of comparison, across several Vitamin C (also known as ascorbic acid and ascorbate) is a water-soluble vitamin found in citrus and other fruits, berries, and vegetables. Merck's veterinary manual states that daily intake of vitamin C at 3–6 mg/kg prevents scurvy in non-human primates. It is also a generic prescription medication and in some countries is sold as a non-prescription dietary supplement.

The mixture is referred to as both xylene and, more precisely, xylenes. Mixed xylenes refers to a mixture of the xylenes plus ethylbenzene. Xylene has a low acute toxicity, with LD50 ranges from 200 to 5000 mg/kg for animals. The principal mechanism of detoxification in organic chemistry, xylene or xylol (from Greek ξύλον (xylon) 'wood'; IUPAC name: dimethylbenzene) is any of three organic compounds with the formula $(CH_3)_2C_6H_4$. Oral LD50 for rats is 4300 mg/kg. They are derived from the substitution of two hydrogen atoms with methyl groups in a benzene ring; which hydrogens are substituted determines which of three structural isomers results. It is a colorless, flammable, slightly greasy liquid of great industrial value.

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
