Deuterium is a heavy hydrogen isotope. Heavy water contains deuterium atoms and is used in nuclear reactors. Semiheavy water (HDO) is more common than pure heavy water, while heavy-oxygen water is denser but lacks unique properties. Tritiated water is radioactive due to tritium content.

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Heavy water Tritium undergoes beta decay into helium-3 Heavy water (deuterium oxide, $2\text{H}_2\text{O}$, D_2O) is a form of water in which hydrogen atoms are all deuterium (2H or D , also known as heavy hydrogen) rather than the common hydrogen-1 isotope (1H , also called protium) that makes up most of the hydrogen in normal water. autoradiography and radioactive labeling. The presence of the heavier isotope gives the water different nuclear properties, and the increase in mass gives it slightly different physical and chemical properties when compared to normal water. It is also used in nuclear weapon design for boosted fission weapons and initiators d401b920fa

needed] The Radiac Survey Meter No 2 or RSM, introduced in 1955, counted particles produced by radioactive decay. Composed mainly of civilian spare-time volunteers, ROC personnel wore a Royal Air Force (RAF) style uniform and latterly came under the administrative control of RAF Strike Command and the operational control of the Home Office. Civilian volunteers were trained and administered by a small cadre of professional full-time officers under the command of the Commandant Royal Observer Corps; latterly a serving RAF Air Commodore. It operated in the United Kingdom between 29 October 1925 and 31 December 1995, when the Corps' civilian volunteers were stood down (ROC headquarters staff at RAF Bentley Priory stood down on 31 March 1996).
