The World Health Organization (WHO) declared the outbreak a public health emergency of international concern (PHEIC) on 30 January 2020, and assessed the outbreak as having become a pandemic on 11 March. Soon after, it spread to other areas of Asia, and then worldwide in early 2020 6170672a39

Smallpox Unlike most DNA viruses, DNA replication in variola virus and other poxviruses takes place within the cytoplasm Smallpox was an infectious disease caused by Variola virus (often called Smallpox virus), which belongs to the genus Orthopoxvirus. transcription of the next set of expressed genes. The last naturally occurring case was diagnosed in October 1977, and the World Health Organization (WHO) certified the global eradication of the disease in 1980, making smallpox the only human disease to have been eradicated to date 6170672a39

The initial symptoms of the disease included fever and vomiting. This was followed by formation of ulcers in the mouth and a skin rash. Over a number of days, the skin rash turned into the characteristic fluid-filled blisters with a dent in the center. The bumps then scabbed over and fell off, leaving scars. The disease was transmitted from one person to another primarily through prolonged face-to-face contact with an infected person... 6170672a39

COVID-19 lab leak theory The possibility of the reemergence of SARS and other novel viruses The COVID-19 lab leak theory, or lab leak hypothesis, is the idea that SARS-CoV-2, the virus that caused the COVID-19 pandemic, came from a laboratory. Several candidate animal species have. Available evidence suggests that the SARS-CoV-2 virus was originally harbored by bats, and spread to humans from infected wild animals, functioning as an intermediate host, at the Huanan Seafood Market in Wuhan, Hubei, China, in December 2019. is a time bomb. together with the culture of eating exotic mammals . This claim is highly controversial; there is a scientific consensus that the

virus is not the result of genetic engineering, and most scientists believe it spilled into human populations through natural zoonosis (transfer directly from an infected non-human animal), similar to the SARS-CoV-1 and MERS-CoV outbreaks, and consistent with other pandemics in human history. viruses 6170672a39

Genome editing CRISPR can be used to target the virus or the host to disrupt Genome editing, or genome engineering, or gene editing, is a type of genetic engineering in which DNA is inserted, deleted, modified or replaced in the genome of a living organism. therapies targeting human viruses such as HIV, herpes, and hepatitis B virus are under research. Unlike early genetic engineering techniques that randomly insert genetic material into a host genome, genome editing targets the insertions to site-specific locations. The basic mechanism involved in genetic manipulations through programmable nucleases is the recognition of target genomic loci and binding of effector DNA-binding domain (DBD), double-strand breaks (DSBs) in target DNA by the restriction endonucleases (FokI and Cas), and the repair of DSBs through homology-directed recombination (HDR) or non-homologous end joining (NHEJ) 6170672a39

COVID-19 symptoms range from asymptomatic to deadly, but most commonly include fever, sore throat, nocturnal cough, and fatigue. Transmission of the virus is often through airborne particles. Mutations have produced many strains (variants) with varying degrees of infectivity and virulence. COVID... 6170672a39

Varicella vaccine Vaccinating a large portion of the population also protects those who are not vaccinated. It is given by injection just under the skin. well as being more dangerous because they contain attenuated live viruses. If given to those who are not immune within five days of exposure to chickenpox it prevents most cases of the disease. Another vaccine, known as zoster vaccine, is used to prevent diseases caused by the same virus – the varicella zoster virus. One dose of vaccine prevents 95% of moderate disease and 100% of severe disease. Two doses of vaccine are more effective than one. In a study performed on children with an impaired immune system, 30% had lost Varicella vaccine, also known as chickenpox vaccine, is a vaccine that protects against chickenpox 6170672a39

Ebola An Ebola vaccine. Symptoms typically start anywhere between two days and three weeks after infection. The first symptoms are usually fever, sore throat, muscle pain, and headaches. These are usually followed by vomiting, diarrhoea, rash and decreased liver and kidney function, at which point some people begin to bleed both internally and externally. Vaccine the fowlpox virus could be grown in embryonated chicken egg. A vaccine typically contains an agent that resembles a disease-causing microorganism and is often made from weakened or killed forms of the microbe, its toxins, or one of its surface proteins. The safety and effectiveness of vaccines has been widely studied and verified. Soon scientists began cultivating other viruses in eggs. Eggs were used for virus propagation A vaccine is a biological preparation that provides active acquired immunity to a particular infectious or malignant disease. The agent stimulates the immune system to recognize the agent as a threat, destroy it, and recognize further and destroy any of the microorganisms associated with that agent that it may encounter in the future 6170672a39
