History of gravitational theory medieval Europe. This work was furthered through the Middle Ages by Indian, Islamic, and European scientists, before gaining great strides during the Renaissance and Scientific Revolution—culminating in the formulation of Newton's law of gravity. The first extant sources discussing such theories are found in ancient Greek philosophy. This was superseded by Albert Einstein's theory of relativity in the early 20th century. There have been numerous theories of gravitation since ancient times. The phenomena of statics were studied by using the dynamic approach so that two trends – statics and dynamics – turned out to be inter-related In physics, theories of gravitation postulate mechanisms of interaction governing the movements of bodies with mass 0d98c2e4b4

Pierre-Simon Laplace Laplace also popularized and further confirmed Sir Isaac Newton's work. In statistics, the Bayesian interpretation of probability was developed mainly by Laplace. This work translated the geometric study of classical mechanics to one based on calculus, opening Pierre-Simon, Marquis de Laplace (; French: [pjɛʁ simɔ̃ laplas]; 23 March 1749 – 5 March 1827) was a French polymath, a scholar whose work has been instrumental in the fields of physics, astronomy, mathematics, engineering, statistics, and philosophy. He summarized and extended the work of his predecessors in his five-volume *Mécanique céleste* (Celestial Mechanics) (1799–1825).
