Functional illiteracy relates to adults and has been defined in different ways: Inability to use reading, writing, and calculation skills for their Literacy is the ability to read and write, while illiteracy refers to an inability to read and write. Some researchers suggest that the study of "literacy" as a concept can be divided into two periods: the period before 1950, when literacy was understood solely as alphabetical literacy (word and letter recognition); and the period after 1950, when literacy slowly began to be considered as a wider concept and process, including the social and cultural aspects of reading, writing, and functional literacy

Phonics Phonics is also known as the alphabetic principle or the alphabetic code. It can be used with any writing system that is alphabetic, such as that of English, Russian, and most other languages. Readers and texts are assigned a Lexile score, where lower scores reflect easier readability for texts and lower reading ability for readers. Thus, Lexile scores do not reflect multiple levels of textual meaning or the maturity of the content. In the U. According to LightSail Education. , Lexile measures are reported annually from reading programs and assessments. The United States Common Core State Standards recommend the use of alternative, qualitative methods to select books for grade 6 and above. Lexile scores are assigned based on individual words and sentence length, rather than qualitative analysis of the content. S

Whole language The method Whole language is a philosophy of reading and a discredited educational method originally developed for teaching literacy in English to young children. However, researchers such as Reid Lyon say reading is "not a natural process", and many students, when learning to read, require direct instruction in alphabetic coding, phonemic awareness, phonics, spelling, and comprehension skills. It is based on the premise that learning to read English comes naturally to humans, especially young children, in the same way that learning to speak develops naturally. language is a philosophy of reading and a discredited educational method originally developed for teaching literacy in English to young children. The method became a major model for education in the United States, Canada, New Zealand, and the UK in the 1980s and 1990s, despite there being no scientific support for the method's effectiveness

Other types of reading and writing, such as pictograms (e.g., a hazard symbol and an emoji), are not based on speech-based writing systems. The common link is the interpretation of symbols to extract the meaning from the visual notations or tactile signals (as in the case of braille).

Readability The concept exists in both natural language and programming languages though in different forms. In programming, things such as programmer comments, choice of loop structure, and choice of names can determine the ease with which humans can read computer program code. The earliest reading ease assessment is the subjective judgment termed text leveling. books, written at a level they could grasp. In natural language, the readability of text depends on its content (the complexity of its vocabulary and syntax) and its presentation (such as typographic aspects that affect legibility, like font size, line height, character spacing, and line length).
