Energy can neither be created nor destroyed; rather, it can only be transformed or transferred from one form to another. The couple received souls in the afterlife and are invoked together in religious inscriptions. The influential emblem book Iconologia of Cesare Ripa (1593, second edition 1603) presents the allegorical figure of Rape with a shield on which the abduction In ancient Greek religion and mythology, Pluto (Ancient Greek: Πλούτων, romanized: Ploutōn) was the ruler of the underworld. Pluto represents a more positive concept of the god who presides over the afterlife. The earlier name for the god was Hades, which became more common as the name of the underworld itself. Ploutōn was frequently conflated with Ploûtos, the Greek god of wealth, because mineral wealth was found underground, and because as a chthonic god Pluto ruled the deep earth that contained the seeds necessary for a bountiful harvest
