Fish anatomy share with larval amphibians. The skin of the fish are a part of the integumentary system, which contains two layers: the epidermis and the dermis layer. The Fish anatomy is the study of the form or morphology of fish. In practice, fish anatomy and fish physiology complement each other, the former dealing with the structure of a fish, its organs or component parts and how they are put together, as might be observed on a dissecting table or under a microscope, and the latter dealing with how those components function together in living fish. It can be contrasted with fish physiology, which is the study of how the component parts of fish function together in the living fish 62e938baeb

Amphibian In its broadest sense, it is a paraphyletic group encompassing all tetrapods, but excluding the amniotes (tetrapods with an amniotic membrane, such as modern reptiles, birds and mammals). All extant (living) amphibians belong to the monophyletic subclass Lissamphibia, with three living orders: Anura (frogs and toads), Urodela (salamanders), and Gymnophiona (caecilians). Their life cycle typically starts out as aquatic larvae with gills known as tadpoles. The integumentary structure contains some typical characteristics common to terrestrial Amphibians are ectothermic, anamniotic, four-limbed vertebrate animals that constitute the class Amphibia. Evolved to be mostly semiaquatic, amphibians have adapted to inhabit a wide variety of habitats, with most species living in freshwater, wetland or terrestrial ecosystems (such as riparian woodland, fossorial and even arboreal habitats). tropical regions of Africa, Asia and Central and South America 62e938baeb

Gastrophryne carolinensis In a study on the unpalatability of their *Gastrophryne carolinensis*, the eastern narrow-mouthed toad, is a species of microhylid frog. using irritating and noxious integumentary secretions as a defense mechanism to discourage predators when caught. The species is highly fossorial, and feeds primarily on ants. While not a true toad, it is so called because it is terrestrial. It is found in the United States, from southern Maryland to the Florida Keys, west to Missouri and Texas. It is a relatively small, toad-like amphibian found in damp, shady habitats. These North American microhylids (Family: Microhylidae) are distinguished from true toads (genus *Bufo*), and other anurans by their moist, smooth skin, their lack of eardrums or tympana, their distinguishable squat body shape, and the unique fold of skin superior to their eyes 62e938baeb

Human anatomy ἀνατομία, "dissection", from ἀνά, "up", and τέμνειν, "cut") is primarily the scientific study of the morphology of the human body. Anatomy, human physiology (the study of function), and biochemistry (the study of the chemistry of living structures) are complementary basic medical sciences that are generally together (or in tandem) to students. Anatomy is subdivided into gross anatomy and microscopic anatomy. Gross anatomy (also called macroscopic anatomy, topographical anatomy, regional anatomy, or anthropotomy) is the study of anatomical structures that can be seen by the naked eye. Other slang names for earthworms include "dew-worm", "rainworm", "nightcrawler", and "angleworm" (from its use as angling hookbait). system contains a pair of nephridia in every segment, except for the first three and the last ones. The three types of nephridia are: integumentary, An earthworm is a soil-dwelling terrestrial invertebrate that belongs to the phylum Annelida. In classical systems, they were in the order of Opisthopora since the male pores opened posterior to the female pores, although the internal male segments are anterior to the female. Larger terrestrial earthworms are also called megadriles (which translates to "big worms") as opposed to the microdriles ("small worms") in the semiaquatic. Theoretical cladistic studies have placed them in the suborder Lumbricina of the order Haplotaxida, but this may change 62e938baeb
