Disaster response It can involve specific but limited aid, such as helping refugees with transport, temporary shelter, and food. It includes warning and evacuation, search and rescue, providing immediate assistance, assessing damage, continuing assistance, and the immediate restoration or construction of infrastructure. The objective is to save lives, ensure health and safety, and meet the subsistence needs of the people affected. for planning for mitigating effects of natural disasters and anticipating and avoiding man-made disasters. Or it can involve establishing semi-permanent settlements in camps and other locations. An example of this would be building provisional storm drains or diversion dams. Emergency response aims to provide immediate help to
