Because plants consume carbon dioxide as they grow, bioethanol has an overall lower carbon footprint than fossil fuels. Substituting Cellulosic ethanol is ethanol (ethyl alcohol) produced from cellulose (the stringy fiber of a plant) rather than from the plant's seeds or fruit. The carbon dioxide that plants absorb as they grow offsets some of the carbon dioxide emitted when ethanol made from them is burned, so cellulosic ethanol fuel has the potential to have a lower carbon footprint than fossil fuels. It can be produced from grasses, wood, algae, or other plants 821560ccaa
