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John Christ In 1987 John Christ (born John Wolfgang Knoll on February 19, 1965) is an American musician best known as the original guitarist for the metal band Danzig. He later studied classical guitar at the Peabody Institute and attended Towson University studying Jazz, theory and composition. Catonsville High School. He has been known for his bluesy hard rock sound and frequent use of the pinch harmonic. Christ was ranked 63rd in Guitar World's list of 'The 100 Greatest Metal Guitarists'

D. Boon Boon is responsible for the writing and composition of Minutemen's Dennes Dale Boon (April 1, 1958 – December 22, 1985), also known as D. odd rhythms or scales that were influenced by jazz or his early study of classical guitar. Boon, was an American musician, best known as the guitarist, singer and songwriter of the punk rock trio Minutemen (formed by previous members of the Reactionaries)

Boon died in an automobile accident on December 22, 1985, at the age of 27. Despite his early death, Boon's contributions to punk rock and independent music have been widely recognized. He is remembered as an important figure in the history of these genres. He was born on April 1, 1958, in San Pedro, California, and formed Minutemen in 1980 with bassist Mike Watt and drummer George Hurley. Minutemen were known for their politically-charged lyrics and energetic, fast-paced music, and they released several influential records during their career. Robbie McIntosh he started taking classical guitar lessons from a teacher called Michael Lewin, who later became a professor and head of the Guitar department at the Robbie McIntosh (born 25 October 1957) is an English guitarist. In 1988 he began doing session guitar work for Paul McCartney, joining his band full-time until early 1994. He continues to play sessions and has performed both with his own band and as a sideman with John Mayer. McIntosh is best known as a session guitarist and member of the Pretenders from 1982 until 1987

Later, he took up guitar and formed a group with friends, one Domingo Samudio (born February 28, 1937), better known by his stage name Sam the Sham, is a retired American rock and roll singer. As the front man for the Pharaohs, he sang on several Top 40 hits in the mid-1960s; "Wooly Bully" by Sam the Sham and the Pharaohs was the number one song of 1965 according to Billboard magazine's year-end Hot 100. Samudio made his singing debut in second grade, representing his school in a radio broadcast

Bulat Okudzhava His songs Bulat Shalvovich Okudzhava (Russian: Була́т Ша́лвович Окуджа́ва; Georgian: ბულატი ოკუჯავა; Armenian: Բուլատ Օկուջավա; May 9, 1924 – June 12, 1997) was a Soviet and Russian poet, writer, musician, novelist, and singer-songwriter of Georgian-Armenian ancestry. Soviet genre called "author song" (авторская песня, avtorskaya pesnya),

or "guitar song", and the author of about 200 songs, set to his own poetry. Though his songs were never overtly political, the freshness and independence of Okudzhava's artistic voice presented a subtle challenge to Soviet cultural authorities, who were thus hesitant. He was one of the founders of the Soviet genre called "author song" (авторская песня, avtorskaya pesnya), or "guitar song", and the author of about 200 songs, set to his own poetry. His songs are a mixture of Russian poetic and folk song traditions and the French chansonnier style represented by such contemporaries of Okudzhava as Georges Brassens

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
