Scientific Young Earth creationism (YEC) is a form of creationism that holds as a central tenet that the Earth and its lifeforms were created by supernatural acts of the Abrahamic God between about 10,000 and 6,000 years ago, contradicting established scientific data that puts the age of Earth around 4.5 billion years.

The earliest clear documentation of the idea of a spherical Earth comes from the ancient Greeks (5th century BC). This knowledge spread with Greek influence such that during the Early Middle Ages (c. 600–1000 AD), most European and Middle Eastern scholars espoused Earth's sphericity.
