Benzodiazepine The first benzodiazepine, chlordiazepoxide (Librium), was discovered accidentally by Leo Sternbach in 1955, and was made available in 1960 by Hoffmann-La Roche, which followed with the development of diazepam (Valium) three years later, in 1963. They are prescribed to treat conditions such as anxiety disorders, insomnia, and seizures. Lippincott Benzodiazepines (BZD, BDZ, BZs), colloquially known as "benzos", are a class of central nervous system (CNS) depressant drugs whose core chemical structure is the fusion of a benzene ring and a diazepine ring.).
