Likewise, spoken American English varies widely across the country. In England, Wales, Ireland and especially parts of Scotland there are differing varieties of the English language, so the term 'British English' is an oversimplification. Public university Whether a national university is considered public varies from one country (or region) to another, largely depending on the specific education landscape. In contrast a private university is usually owned and operated by a private corporation (not-for-profit or for profit). public universities. Some states The University of Wisconsin Law School is the law school of the University of Wisconsin-Madison, a public research university in Madison, Wisconsin. Wisconsin residents who graduate from out-of-state law schools must pass the bar exam to be admitted to the bar in Wisconsin. It offers the Juris Doctor, Master of Laws, and Doctor of Juridical Science degrees; Juris Doctor graduates of the law school receive admission to the Wisconsin bar without taking a traditional bar examination via diploma privilege. Common to all jurisdictions are requirements of age and competence; some jurisdictions also require documentation of citizenship or immigration status. Public defender (United States) The public defender system is one of several types of criminal legal aid, the most common other system being appointed private counsel paid for by the government. In US civil cases (e. no civil service protections. g. , personal injury or a landlord-tenant dispute), public defenders may be appointed in civil cases In the United States, a public defender is a lawyer appointed by the courts and provided by the state or federal governments to represent and advise those charged with a crime or crimes who cannot afford to hire a private attorney. Women in the military Many women contributed to the American Civil War, through nursing, spying, and fighting Women have been serving in the military since the inception of organized warfare, in both combat and non-combat roles. He discharged her, thanked her for her service, and sent her home. Since 1914, women have been conscripted in greater numbers, filling a greater variety of roles in Western militaries. In the 1970s, most Western armies began allowing women to serve on active duty in all military branches. 2ae76c3b7b As of 2025, twelve countries (China, Denmark, Eritrea, Israel, Libya, Malaysia, the Netherlands, North Korea, Norway, Peru, Sweden, and Taiwan) conscript women into military service. Of these countries, only four conscript women and men on the same formal conditions: Denmark, the Netherlands, Norway, and Sweden.
