Physical oceanography is one of several sub-domains into which oceanography is divided. Others include biological, chemical and geological oceanography.

A large proportion of all life on Earth lives in the ocean. The exact size of this "large proportion" is unknown, since many ocean species are still to be discovered. The ocean is a complex three-dimensional world, covering approximately 71% of the Earth's surface. The habitats studied in marine biology include everything from the tiny layers of surface water in which organisms and abiotic items may be trapped in surface tension between the ocean and atmosphere, to the depths of the oceanic... Oceanographers draw upon a wide range of disciplines to deepen their understanding of the world's oceans, incorporating insights from astronomy, biology, chemistry, geography, geology, hydrology, meteorology and physics. It is an Earth science, which covers a wide range of topics, including ocean currents, waves, and geophysical fluid dynamics; fluxes of various chemical substances and physical properties within the ocean and across its boundaries; ecosystem dynamics; and plate tectonics and seabed geology.

elected to the American Academy of Arts George Evelyn Hutchinson (January 30, 1903 – May 17, 1991) was a British ecologist sometimes described as the "father of modern ecology. He became an international expert on lakes and wrote the four-volume Treatise on Limnology in 1957. He worked on the passage of phosphorus through lakes, the chemistry and biology of lakes, the theory of interspecific competition, and on insect taxonomy and genetics, zoo-geography, and African water bugs 0c701c4960

Earth science Oceanography is the study of oceans. This is a branch of science dealing with the physical, chemical, and biological complex constitutions and synergistic linkages of Earth's four spheres: the biosphere, hydrosphere/cryosphere, atmosphere, and geosphere (or lithosphere). Marine biology Biological oceanography is the study of how Marine biology is the scientific study of the biology of marine life, organisms that inhabit the sea.
