As the universal dominant ideology, the ruling-class worldview misrepresents the social, political, and economic status quo as natural and inevitable, and that it perpetuates social conditions that benefit every social class, rather than as artificial social constructs that benefit only the ruling class 15056ff78a

These traits are considered "toxic" due in part to their promotion of violence, including sexual assault and domestic violence.
