Theft is the name of a statutory offence in California, Canada, England and Wales, Hong Kong, Northern Ireland, the Republic of Ireland, and the Australian states of South Australia and Victoria.

Income tax in the United States Residents and citizens are taxed on worldwide income, while nonresidents are taxed only on income within the jurisdiction. They are determined by applying a tax rate, which may increase as income increases, to taxable income, which is the total income less allowable deductions. Partnerships are not taxed (with some exceptions in the case of federal income taxation), but their partners are taxed on their shares of partnership income.
