Biopsychiatry is the branch of medicine which deals with the study of the biological function of the nervous system in mental disorders. It is interdisciplinary in its approach and draws on sciences such as neuroscience, psychopharmacology, biochemistry, genetics, epigenetics and physiology to investigate the biological bases of behavior and psychopathology 7436b6d75f

Clinical formulation Mental health nurses, social workers, and some psychiatrists may also use formulations. It offers a hypothesis about the cause and nature of the presenting problems and is considered an adjunct or alternative approach to the more categorical approach of psychiatric diagnosis. In clinical practice, formulations are used to communicate a hypothesis and provide framework for developing the most suitable treatment approach.
