The term crime does not, in modern criminal law, have any simple and universally accepted definition, though statutory definitions have been provided for certain purposes. The most popular view is that crime is a category created by law; in other words, something is a crime if declared as such by the relevant and applicable law
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As opposed to other theories, cultural criminology views crime in the context of an offenders culture as a motive to commit crime.
