Black nationalism Modern Black nationalism often aims for the social, political, and economic empowerment of Black communities within white majority societies, either as an alternative to assimilation or as a way to ensure greater representation and equality within predominantly Eurocentric cultures. Black nationalism is a nationalist movement which seeks representation for Black people as a distinct national identity, especially in racialized, colonial Black nationalism is a nationalist movement which seeks representation for Black

Its earliest proponents saw it as a way to advocate for democratic representation in culturally plural societies or to establish self-governing independent nation-states for Black people b1518b54b5

The movement also encouraged men and women to stop trying to eliminate African-identified traits by attempting to lighten or bleach their skin. While thinkers such as Malcolm X influenced the early movement, the views of the Black Panther

Party, founded in 1966, are widely seen as the cornerstone. The 1965 assassination of Malcolm X, coupled with the urban riots of 1964 and 1965, ignited the movement. Many of its ideas were influenced by Malcolm X's criticism of Martin Luther King Jr. emphasize their identity b1518b54b5
