English phonology Like many other languages, English has wide variation in pronunciation, both historically and from dialect to dialect. common for Welsh English speakers, possibly because of the importance of aspiration for distinguishing /p t k/ from /b d g/ in Welsh phonology, or because English phonology is the system of speech sounds used in spoken English. Among other things, most dialects have vowel reduction in unstressed syllables and a complex set of phonological features that distinguish fortis and lenis consonants (stops, affricates, and fricatives). In general, however, the regional dialects of English share a largely similar (but not identical) phonological system d95eed4416

The two main phonological features that mark South African English as distinct are the behaviour of the vowels in KIT and PALM. The KIT vowel tends to be "split" so that there is a clear allophonic variation between the front [ɪ] and central [ɨ] or [ə]. The PALM vowel is characteristically back in the General and Broad varieties of SAE. The tendency to monophthongise /ɑʊ/ and /aɪ/ to [e:] and [a:] respectively, are also typical features of General and Broad White... d95eed4416 There is no overall consensus on the number of contrastive sounds (phonemes), but common approaches recognize at least

12 distinct consonants (as many as 21 in some analyses) and 5 distinct vowels, /a, e, i, o, u/. Phonetic length is contrastive for both vowels and consonants, and the total length of Japanese words can be measured in a unit of timing called the mora (from Latin mora "delay"). Only limited types of consonant clusters are permitted.
