

Cancer Pain

Lung cancer shortness of breath, or chest pain. Lung cancer is caused by genetic damage to the DNA of cells in the airways, often caused by cigarette smoking or inhaling damaging chemicals. Pain The International Association for the Study of Pain defines pain as "an unpleasant sensory and emotional experience associated with, or resembling that associated with, actual or potential tissue damage. neuropathy, cancer, and idiopathic pain, may persist for years. ". Pain that lasts a long time is called "chronic" or "persistent", and pain that resolves Pain is a distressing feeling often caused by intense or damaging stimuli bbeaaa30c5

Cancer pain Pain in cancer may arise from a tumor compressing or infiltrating nearby body parts; from treatments and diagnostic procedures; or from skin, nerve and Pain in cancer may arise from a tumor compressing or infiltrating nearby body parts; from treatments and diagnostic procedures; or from skin, nerve and other changes caused by a hormone imbalance or immune response. However, radiotherapy, surgery and chemotherapy may produce painful conditions that persist long after treatment has ended. Most chronic (long-lasting) pain is caused by the illness and most acute (short-term) pain is caused by treatment or diagnostic procedures bbeaaa30c5

Bone pain Pain caused by cancer within bones is one of the most severe forms of pain. It occurs as a result of a wide range of diseases or physical conditions or both, and may severely impair the quality of life. chronic wear and tear for several years. Because of its severity and uniqueness Bone pain (also known medically by several other names) is pain coming from a bone, and is caused by damaging stimuli bbeaaa30c5

Cancer treatment Cancer treatments are a wide range of treatments available for the many different types of cancer, with each cancer type needing its own specific treatment Cancer treatments are a wide range of treatments available for the many different types of cancer, with each cancer type needing its own specific treatment. Treatments can include surgery, chemotherapy, radiation therapy, hormonal therapy, targeted therapy including small-molecule drugs or monoclonal antibodies, and PARP inhibitors such as olaparib. Most commonly cancer treatment involves a series of separate therapies such as chemotherapy before surgery. Angiogenesis inhibitors are sometimes used to enhance the effects of immunotherapies. Other therapies include hyperthermia, immunotherapy, photodynamic therapy, and stem-cell therapy bbeaaa30c5

Pain motivates organisms to withdraw from damaging situations, to protect a damaged body part while it heals, and to avoid similar experiences in the future. Congenital insensitivity to pain may result in reduced life expectancy. Most pain resolves once the noxious stimulus is removed and the body has healed, but it may persist despite removal of the stimulus and apparent healing of the body. Sometimes pain arises in the absence of any detectable stimulus, damage or disease. bbeaaa30c5

Alternative cancer treatments intended to treat side effects rather than to kill cancer cells. Most alternative cancer treatments do not have high-quality evidence supporting their use and many have been described as pseudoscientific. About Alternative cancer treatment describes any cancer treatment or practice that is not part of the conventional standard of cancer care. Despite this, many untested and disproven treatments are used around the world. Concerns have been raised about the safety of some purported treatments, and some have been found unsafe in clinical trials. Medical massage and self-hypnosis to treat pain are examples of complementary treatments. These include special diets and exercises, chemicals, herbs, devices, and manual procedures bbeaaa30c5

Signs and symptoms of cancer Unexplained Cancer symptoms are changes in the body caused by the presence of cancer. There are more than 100 different types of cancer with a wide range of signs and symptoms which can manifest in different ways. They are usually caused by the effect of a cancer on the part of the body where it is growing, although the disease can cause more

general symptoms such as weight loss or tiredness. of cancer Unexplained pain: Pain that persists, has no clear cause, and does not respond to treatment may be a warning sign of many types of cancers bbeaaa30c5

Causes of cancer pain Cancer pain can be caused by pressure on, or chemical stimulation of, specialised pain-signalling nerve endings called nociceptors (nociceptive pain), Cancer pain can be caused by pressure on, or chemical stimulation of, specialised pain-signalling nerve endings called nociceptors (nociceptive pain), or by damage or illness affecting nerve fibers themselves (neuropathic pain) bbeaaa30c5

Chronic pain This type of pain is in contrast to acute pain, which is pain associated with a cause that can be relieved by treating the cause, and decreases or stops when the cause improves. It is also known as gradual burning pain, electrical pain, throbbing pain, and nauseating pain. Persistent pain often serves no apparent useful purpose. Chronic pain can last for years.
