Felsing's book A Practical Guide to Feature-Driven Development[2] (published in 2002), a more general description of FDD was given. Feature-driven development (FDD) is an iterative and incremental software development process. These practices are driven from the perspective of delivering functionality (features) valued by the client. Its main purpose is to deliver tangible, working software repeatedly in a timely manner in accordance with the Principles behind the agile manifesto. FDD blends several best practices into a cohesive whole. It is a lightweight or agile method for developing software.

Based on the criteria for measuring correctness from an oracle, software testing employs principles and mechanisms that might recognize a problem. Examples of oracles include specifications, contracts, comparable products, past versions of the same product, inferences about intended or expected purpose, user or customer expectations, relevant standards, and applicable laws.
