Rosa Parks Under the guise of grading exams, Robinson collaborated with two Rosa Louise McCauley Parks (February 4, 1913 – October 24, 2005) was an American civil rights activist. She is best known for her refusal to move from her seat on a bus in Montgomery, Alabama, in defiance of Jim Crow racial segregation laws, in 1955, which sparked the Montgomery bus boycott. a one-day boycott of Montgomery buses on December 5, 1955, the day of Parks's trial. She is sometimes known as the "mother of the civil rights movement"

Subhas Chandra Bose He succeeded with distinction in the first exam but demurred at taking the routine final exam, citing nationalism to be the higher calling. examination. The honorific 'Netaji' (Hindustani: "Respected Leader") was first applied to Bose in Germany in early 1942—by the Indian soldiers of the Indische Legion and by the German and Indian officials in the Special Bureau for India in Berlin. Returning Subhas Chandra Bose (23 January 1897 – 18 August 1945) was an Indian nationalist whose defiance of British authority in India made him a hero among many Indians, but his wartime alliances with Nazi Germany and Fascist Japan left a legacy vexed by authoritarianism, anti-Semitism, and military failure. It is now used throughout India

Windsor began her career on stage in 1950 at the age of 13, and made her film debut as a schoolgirl in *The Belles of St. Trinian's* (1954) while studying shipping management at Bow Technical College. Despite policies designed to disenfranchise Black citizens, Parks successfully registered to vote after three separate attempts between 1943 and 1945. She investigated cases and organized...
