Buddha footprint Many of the "natural" ones are acknowledged not to be genuine footprints of the Buddha, but rather replicas or representations of them, which can be considered cetiya (Buddhist relics) and also an early aniconic and symbolic representation of the Buddha. Buddhist legend holds that during his lifetime the Buddha flew to Sri Lanka and left his footprint on Buddha's footprints (Sanskrit: Buddhapada)(Tibetan: ཐུགས་རྒྱུ་མཚན་)are Buddhist icons shaped like an imprint of Gautama Buddha's foot or both feet. Buddha-nature "Buddha-nature" is the common English translation for several related Mahāyāna Buddhist terms, most notably tathāgatagarbha and buddhadhātu, but also sugatagarbha, and buddhagarbha. Tathāgatagarbha can mean "the womb" or "embryo" (garbha) of the "thus-gone one" (tathāgata), and can also mean "containing a tathāgata".
