Whole language diverse literature; integrating literacy into other areas of the curriculum, especially math, science, and social studies; frequent reading; with students Whole language is a philosophy of reading and a discredited educational method originally developed for teaching literacy in English to young children. It is based on the premise that learning to read English comes naturally to humans, especially young children, in the same way that learning to speak develops naturally. However, researchers such as Reid Lyon say reading is "not a natural process", and many students, when learning to read, require direct instruction in alphabetic coding, phonemic awareness, phonics, spelling, and comprehension skills. The method became a major model for education in the United States, Canada, New Zealand, and the UK in the 1980s and 1990s, despite there being no scientific support for the method's effectiveness 76c4f68857

This has expanded the scope of digital rhetoric to account for the increased fluidity with which humans interact with technology. Historian Mark Hailwood suggests another two type of near-literacy in Early Modern England, of Literacy is the ability to read and write, while illiteracy refers to an inability to read and write 76c4f68857
