Greek: Πλούτων, romanized: Ploutōn) was the ruler of the underworld. The earlier name for the god was Hades, which became more common as the name of the underworld itself. Ovid, *Metamorphoses* 3. 77, as noted by Jebb, Sophocles, p. 115. Pluto represents a more positive concept of the god who presides over the afterlife. Ploutōn was frequently conflated with Ploutos, the Greek god of wealth, because mineral wealth was found underground, and because as a chthonic god Pluto ruled the deep earth that contained the seeds necessary for a bountiful harvest fb7ec104d2

Narcissus (plant) Narcissus has conspicuous flowers with six petal-like tepals surmounted by a cup- or trumpet-shaped corona. Various common names including daffodil, narcissus (plural narcissi), and jonquil, are used to describe some or all members of the genus. The flowers are generally white and yellow (also orange or pink in garden varieties), with either uniform or contrasting coloured tepals and corona. The poet Ovid also dealt with the mythology of the narcissus. In his *Metamorphoses*, he recounts the story of the youth Narcissus who, after his Narcissus is a genus of predominantly spring flowering perennial plants of the amaryllis family, Amaryllidaceae.
