X-ray This was a result An X-ray (also known in many languages as Röntgen radiation) is a form of high-energy electromagnetic radiation with a wavelength shorter than those of ultraviolet rays and longer than those of gamma rays. Austin of Dartmouth College tested all of the discharge tubes in the physics laboratory and found that only the Pulu tube produced X-rays. Roughly, X-rays have a wavelength ranging from 10 nanometers to 10 picometers, corresponding to frequencies in the range of 30 petahertz to 30 exahertz (3×10^{16} Hz to 3×10^{19} Hz) and photon energies in the range of 100 eV to 100 keV, respectively
