Rhetoric of health and medicine Primary topics of focus includes patient-physician communication, health literacy, language The rhetoric of health and

medicine (or medical rhetoric) is an academic discipline concerning language and symbols in health and medicine. As a subfield of rhetoric, medical rhetoric specifically analyzes and evaluates the structure, delivery, and intention of communications messages in medicine- and health-related contexts. Primary topics of focus includes patient-physician communication, health literacy, language that constructs disease knowledge, and pharmaceutical advertising (including both direct-to-consumer and direct-to-physician advertising). The general research areas are described below. Medical rhetoric is a more focused subfield. Rhetoric most commonly refers to the persuasive element in human interactions and is often best studied in the specific situations in which it occurs f6e9b0cf41

End-of-life care is most commonly provided at home, in the hospital, or in a long-term care facility with care being provided by family members, nurses, social workers, physicians, and other support staff. Facilities may also have palliative or hospice care teams that will provide end-of-life care services. Decisions about end-of-life care are often informed by medical, financial and ethical considerations. f6e9b0cf41

Medical record An increasing purpose The terms medical record, health record and medical chart are used somewhat interchangeably to describe the systematic documentation of a single patient's medical history and care across time within one particular health care provider's jurisdiction. The maintenance of complete and accurate medical records is a requirement of health care providers and is generally enforced as a licensing or certification prerequisite. patient care and documenting communication among patient and health care provider and professionals contributing to the patient's care. A medical record includes a variety of types of "notes" entered over time by healthcare professionals, recording observations and administration of drugs and therapies, orders for the administration of drugs and therapies, test results, X-rays, reports, etc f6e9b0cf41

They are contrasted with referential questions (or information-seeking questions), a type of question posed when the answer is not known by the questioner at the time of inquiry f6e9b0cf41

Terminal illness An illness which is lifelong but not life-shortening is. An illness which will result in premature death, even if that death may be many years away, is called a life-limiting illness. A patient who has such an illness may be referred to as a terminal patient, terminally ill or simply as being terminal. This term is more commonly used for progressive diseases such as cancer, rather than fatal injury. While terminal condition prognosis is often a grave matter, doctors do not wish to Terminal illness or end-stage disease is a disease that cannot be cured or adequately treated and is expected to result in the death of the patient. In popular use, it indicates a disease that will progress until death with near absolute certainty, regardless of treatment. There is no standardized life expectancy for a patient to be considered terminal, although it is generally months or less. often ambiguity in communication with the patient about their condition f6e9b0cf41

Medical malpractice in the United States Thus, when a patient claims injury as the result of a medical professional's care, a malpractice case will most often Medical malpractice is professional negligence by act or omission by a health care provider in which the treatment provided falls below the accepted standard of practice in the medical community and causes injury or death to the patient, with most cases involving medical error. negligent treatment and failure to warn. Claims of medical malpractice, when pursued in US courts, are processed as civil torts. Sometimes an act of medical malpractice will also constitute a criminal act, as in the case of the death of Michael Jackson f6e9b0cf41

Medical professionals may obtain professional liability insurances to offset the costs of lawsuits based on medical malpractice. Since the 1990s, many palliative care programs involved a disease-specific approach. However, as the field developed... f6e9b0cf41 When the sender gives a message, the receiver repeats this back. The sender then confirms the message, commonly using the word "yes". When the receiver incorrectly repeats the message back, the sender will say "negative" (or something similar) and then repeat the correct message. If the sender, the person giving the message, does not get a reply back, he must repeat it until the receiver starts closing the loop. To get the attention of the receiver, the sender can use the receiver's name or functional position, touch their shoulder, etc. f6e9b0cf41

Palliative care Many definitions of palliative care exist. improve healthcare quality in three sectors: Physical and emotional relief, strengthening of patient-physician communication and decision-making, and coordinated Palliative care (from Latin root palliare "to cloak") is an interdisciplinary medical care-giving approach aimed at optimizing quality of life and mitigating or reducing suffering among people with serious, complex, and often terminal illnesses f6e9b0cf41

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
