Abdominal hair The abdominal hair of non-human mammals is part of the pelage, (hair or fur). The growth of abdominal hair follows the same pattern on nearly all mammals, vertically from the pubic area upwards and from the thorax downwards to the navel. Hat and Fragrance Textile Gallery Quilts The Hat and Fragrance Textile Gallery is an exhibit space at Shelburne Museum in Shelburne, Vermont which houses quilts, hatboxes, and various other textiles. In 1954, Shelburne Museum was the first museum to exhibit quilts as works of art; prior to this exhibition quilts were only shown as accessories in historic houses. patriotic patterns. The name "Hat and Fragrance" refers both to Electra Havemeyer Webb's collection of hatboxes and to the fragrant, herbal sachets used to preserve textiles. Iron meteorites are very often formed from a single crystal of iron-nickel alloy, or sometimes several large crystals that may be many meters in size, and often lack any discernible crystal boundary on the surface. Large crystals are scarce in metals, and in meteors they occur from extremely slow cooling from a molten state in the vacuum of space when the Solar System first formed. Patterned ground The geometric shapes and patterns associated with patterned ground Patterned ground is the distinct and often symmetrical natural pattern of geometric shapes formed by the deformation of ground material in periglacial regions. The mechanism of the formation of patterned ground had long puzzled scientists but the introduction of computer-generated geological models in the past 20 years has allowed scientists to relate it to frost heaving, the expansion that occurs when wet, fine-grained, and porous. alternate; patterned ground has also been observed in the hyper-arid Atacama Desert and on Mars. The geometric shapes and patterns associated with patterned ground are often mistaken as artistic human creations. It is typically found in remote regions of the Arctic, Antarctica, and the Outback in Australia, but is also found anywhere that freezing and thawing of soil alternate; patterned ground has also been observed in the hyper-arid Atacama Desert and on Mars 7f8e87dd12

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Patterns in nature The modern understanding of visible patterns developed gradually over time. Patterns in nature are visible regularities of form found in the natural world. Natural patterns include symmetries, trees, spirals, meanders, waves, foams, tessellations, cracks and stripes. These patterns recur in different contexts and can sometimes be modelled mathematically. Early Greek philosophers studied pattern, with Plato, Pythagoras and Empedocles attempting to explain order in nature. The concept applies also to sacred spaces such as temenoi, sacred groves, village greens, pagodas and holy wells, Mandala Gardens and the creation of religious and spiritual art. It is associated with the belief of a divine creator of the universal geometer. geometry ascribes symbolic and sacred meanings to certain geometric shapes and certain geometric proportions. The geometry used in the design and construction of religious structures such as churches, temples, mosques, religious monuments, altars, and tabernacles has sometimes been considered sacred 7f8e87dd12

Widmanstätten pattern also used on non-meteoritic material to indicate a structure with a geometrical pattern resulting from the formation of a new phase along particular crystallographic A Widmanstätten pattern (VID-man-shtay-tin), also known as a Thomson structure, is a figure of long phases of nickel-iron, found in the octahedrite shapes of iron meteorite crystals and some pallasites 7f8e87dd12
