In 1916, Albert Einstein demonstrated that gravitational waves result from his general theory of relativity as ripples in spacetime. They were proposed by Oliver Heaviside in 1893 and then later by Henri Poincaré in 1905 as the gravitational equivalent of electromagnetic waves

It deals with environments in which neither gravitational nor quantum effects can be ignored, such as in the vicinity of black holes or similar compact astrophysical objects, as well as in the early stages of the universe moments after the Big Bang

Mass Mass in modern physics has multiple definitions which are conceptually distinct, but physically equivalent. It was found that different atoms and different elementary particles, theoretically with the same amount of matter, have nonetheless different masses. Mass can be experimentally defined as a measure of the body's inertia, meaning the resistance to acceleration (change of velocity) when a net force is applied. The SI base unit of mass is the kilogram (kg). It was traditionally believed to be related to the quantity of matter in a body, until the discovery of the atom and particle physics. Le Sage's theory of gravitation This mechanical explanation for gravity never gained widespread acceptance. According to this model, any two material bodies partially shield each other from the impinging corpuscles, resulting in a net imbalance in the pressure exerted by the impact of corpuscles on the bodies, tending to drive the bodies together. In Newton's model, gravity is the result of an attractive force between massive objects. Although even Newton was troubled by the unknown nature of that force, the basic framework was extremely successful at describing motion. ce867ff09f Three of the four fundamental forces of nature are described within the framework of quantum mechanics and quantum field theory: the electromagnetic interaction, the strong force, and the weak force; this leaves gravity as the only interaction that has not been fully accommodated.
