History emerged as a field of inquiry History is the systematic study of the past, focusing primarily on the human past. Similar debates surround the purpose of history—for example, whether its

main aim is theoretical, to uncover the truth, or practical, to learn lessons from the past. Some theorists categorize history as a social science, while others see it as part of the humanities or consider it a hybrid discipline

Sociological subject matter ranges from micro-level analyses of individual interaction and agency to macro-level analyses of social systems and social structure. Geography Geography is an all-encompassing discipline that seeks an understanding of Earth and its human and natural complexities—not merely where objects are, but also how they have changed and come to be. Common techniques include cartography, remote sensing, interviews, and surveying. "

Geography is a systematic study Geography (from Ancient Greek γεωγραφία *geōgraphía*; combining *gê* 'Earth' and *gráphō* 'write', literally 'Earth writing') is the study of the lands, features, inhabitants, and phenomena of Earth. While geography is specific to Earth, many concepts can be applied more broadly to other celestial bodies in the field of planetary
