Zinc The most common zinc ore is sphalerite (zinc blende), a zinc sulfide mineral. The largest workable lodes are in Australia, Asia, and the United States. It is the first element in group 12 (IIB) of the periodic table. F. In some respects, zinc is chemically similar to magnesium: both elements exhibit only one normal oxidation state (+2), and the Zn^{2+} and Mg^{2+} ions are of similar size. Zinc is refined by froth flotation of the ore, roasting, and final extraction using electricity (electrowinning).
