

A Tune A Day For Trumpet Or Cornet

C. Paul Herfurth In 1922 he moved to New Jersey and organised that state's first full instrumental music program. Although best known for his Tune a Day books, Herfurth also edited and arranged many collections for violin, cello and viola with piano. " This source explains that Herfurth later enlisted the services of Hugh M. Music company in 1937. Stuart and. Others quickly followed: Tune a Day for Cornet (Trumpet) Instruction (1941), titles for clarinet, string bass, trombone (baritone) and Clarence Paul Herfurth was the first author of the Tune a Day books, which are used across the English speaking world to teach music. According to A Tune a Day: Trombone or Euphonium (1944), Herfurth was born in 1893, and "began violin lessons at the age of seven and studied in Germany for a year before entering the New England Conservatory of Music in 1911. Graduating in 1916, his first school position was at Asheville, North Carolina. He now lives in retirement in Florida cdbb241a34

Edwin Eugene Bagley " Bagley (May 29, 1857 – January 29, 1922) was an American composer most famous for composing the march National Emblem. E. A. Couturier He promoted the Holton Band Instrument Company for a Ernst Albert Couturier (September 30, 1869 in Poughkeepsie – February 28, 1950 in Wingdale) was best known as a cornet player who toured as a "virtuoso" performer on the concert programs of bands of the day. He promoted the Holton Band Instrument Company for a decade in that capacity before applying his own unique inventions to the production of his own line of brass band instruments between 1918 and 1923. a cornet player who toured as a "virtuoso" performer on the concert programs of bands of the day cdbb241a34

These instruments are used instead of French horns for marching because their bells face forward instead of to the back (or to the side), as dissipation of the sound becomes a concern in the open-air environment of marching. Tuning is done solely by adjusting the tuning slide, unlike the French horn where the pitch is affected by the hand position in the bell. Fingerings for the mellophone are the... cdbb241a34

Mellophone likewise more conical than the trumpet or trombone. The marching mellophone is used in place of the horn for marching because it is a bell-front instrument allowing The mellophone is a brass instrument used in marching bands and drum and bugle corps in place of French horns. It is a middle-voiced instrument, typically pitched in the key of F, though models in E $\flat$, D, C, and G (as a bugle) have also historically existed. It can also be used to play French horn parts in concert bands and orchestras. It has a conical bore, like that of the euphonium and flugelhorn

Bagley was born in Craftsbury, Vermont on May 29, 1857. He began his music career at age nine as a vocalist and comedian with Leavitt's Bellringers, a company of entertainers that toured many of the larger cities of the United States. Bagley began playing the cornet, traveling with the Swiss Bellringers for six years. After his touring days, Bagley joined Blaisdell's Orchestra of Concord, New Hampshire. cdbb241a34

First Suite in E-flat for Military Band Along with the subsequent Second Suite in F for Military Band, written in 1911 and premiered in 1922, the First Suite convinced many other prominent composers that serious music could be written specifically for band. Officially premiered in 1920 at the Royal Military School of Music, the manuscript was originally completed in 1909. 1 is written by the English composer Gustav Holst. In 1880, Bagley came to Boston as a solo cornet player at The Park Theater. For nine years, he traveled with the Bostonians, an opera company. While with this company, Bagley changed from cornet to trombone. He also performed with the Germania Band of Boston... cdbb241a34

Jack Jackson (radio personality) staying until 1930 as the orchestra's lead trumpet and cornet. During this time, he also "freelanced" for numerous bands and studio orchestras. The BBC's nickname "Auntie" is often credited to Jackson. After Jack Jackson (20 February 1906 – 15 January 1978) was an English trumpeter and bandleader popular during the British dance band era, and who later became a highly influential radio disc jockey cdbb241a34

King Porter Stomp as a piano solo, but did not file a copyright on the tune until 1924. It became a hit during the swing era, when it was recorded by Benny Goodman. That year, Morton recorded a duet version with Joe "King" Oliver on cornet. Morton "King Porter Stomp" is a jazz standard by pianist Jelly Roll Morton, first recorded in 1923. The composition is considered to be important in the development of jazz cdbb241a34
