Silver is found in the Earth's crust in the pure, free elemental form ("native silver"), as an alloy with gold and other metals, and in minerals such as argentite and chlorargyrite. A soft, whitish-gray, lustrous transition metal, it exhibits the highest electrical conductivity, thermal conductivity, and reflectivity of any metal. However The Nelson class was a class of two battleships (Nelson and Rodney) of the British Royal Navy, built shortly after, and under the terms of, the Washington Naval Treaty of 1922. Zinc Zinc is refined by froth flotation of the ore, roasting, and final extraction using

electricity (electrowinning). The most common zinc ore is sphalerite (zinc blende), a zinc sulfide mineral. Corrosion-resistant zinc plating of iron (hot-dip galvanizing) Zinc is a chemical element; it has symbol Zn and atomic number 30. It is the first element in group 12 (IIB) of the periodic table. Work by Luigi Galvani and Alessandro Volta uncovered the electrochemical properties of zinc by 1800. Zinc is the 24th most abundant element in Earth's crust and has five stable isotopes. The largest workable lodes are in Australia, Asia, and the United States. In some respects, zinc is chemically similar to magnesium: both elements exhibit only one normal oxidation state (+2), and the Zn^{2+} and Mg^{2+} ions are of similar size. It is a slightly brittle metal at room temperature and has a shiny-greyish appearance when oxidation is removed 7dee585a36

In planning a new battleship class in the 1930s, the US Navy was heavily constrained by international treaty limitations, which included a requirement that all new capital ships have a standard displacement of under 35,000 LT (35,600 t).
