The test was established at the leading urgency of Oxford University as an answer to the problem facing universities trying to select from an increasingly competitive pool with similarly high A-levels. There are now nine participating law schools and hundreds of test centres worldwide

The test has existed in some form since 1948, when it was created to give law schools a standardized way to assess applicants in addition to their GPA. The current form of the exam has been used since 1991. Kolmogorov–Smirnov test Intuitively, it provides a method to qualitatively answer the question "How likely is it that we would see a collection of samples like this if they were drawn from that probability distribution. A number of universities across the world accept the test as an optional part of their application process for mathematics-based courses.
