Later in 1941, *The Long Winter* became an Honor Book, and the two later Honor Books were *Little Town on the Prairie*, in 1942, and *These Happy The Little House on the Prairie* books comprise a series of American children's novels written by Laura Ingalls Wilder (b. The first draft of a ninth novel was published posthumously in 1971 and is commonly included in the series. A tenth book, the non-fiction *On the Way Home*, is Laura Ingalls Wilder's diary of the years after 1894, when she, her husband and their daughter moved from De Smet, South Dakota to Mansfield, Missouri, where they settled permanently.
