Prior to her elections to Congress, Titus was a professor of political science at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV), and was the Democratic nominee for governor of Nevada in 2006, losing to Republican Jim Gibbons.

Titus Andronicus was initially very popular, but by the later 17th century it was not well esteemed. The Victorian era disapproved of it, largely because of its graphic violence. Its reputation began to

improve around the middle of the 20th century, but it is still one of Shakespeare's least respected plays. df60ac8ff4 During his father's rule, Titus gained notoriety in Rome serving as prefect of the Praetorian Guard, and for carrying on a controversial relationship with the Jewish queen Berenice. Despite concerns over his character, Titus ruled to great acclaim following the death of Vespasian on 23 June 79, and was considered a good... df60ac8ff4 Before becoming emperor, Titus gained renown as a military commander, serving under his father in Judaea during the First Jewish–Roman War. The campaign came to a brief halt with the death of emperor Nero in AD 68, launching Vespasian's bid for the imperial power during the Year of the Four Emperors. When Vespasian was declared Emperor on 1 July 69, Titus was left in charge of ending the Jewish rebellion. In AD 70, he besieged and captured Jerusalem, and destroyed the city and the Second Temple.
