Nutrient cycle Mineral cycles include the carbon cycle, sulfur cycle, nitrogen cycle, water cycle, phosphorus cycle, oxygen cycle, among others that continually recycle along with other mineral nutrients into productive ecological nutrition. The breadth of Whewell's endeavours is his most remarkable feature. In a time of increasing specialisation, Whewell belonged in an earlier era when natural philosophers investigated widely. He published work in mechanics, physics, geology, astronomy, and economics, while also composing poetry, writing a Bridgewater Treatise, translating the works of Goethe, and writing sermons and theological tracts. In mathematics, Whewell introduced what is now called the Whewell equation, defining the shape of a curve without reference to an arbitrarily chosen coordinate system. Theodor Thon studied mineralogy. In 1811, he received a doctorate for a new system of mineral classification. He taught a wide range of subjects at the University of Jena including some of the first academic lectures in stenography. His son Sixtus Armin Thon became an engraver. He worked as a docent and in 1813 he moved to Eisenach Theodor Thon (14 May 1792 – 17 November 1838) was a German naturalist, engraver, and inventor of a shorthand writing system 9974810ff7

Frederick Soddy He also proved the existence of isotopes of certain radioactive elements. Soddy was a polymath who mastered chemistry, nuclear physics, statistical mechanics, finance, and economics. In 1921, he received the Nobel Prize in Chemistry "for his contributions to our knowledge of the chemistry of radioactive substances, and his investigations into the origin and nature of isotopes" 9974810ff7

Nicholas Georgescu-Roegen He is best known today for his 1971 magnum opus The Entropy Law and the Economic Process, in which he argued that all natural resources are irreversibly degraded when put to use in economic activity. beyond pure mathematics. Not only did he attend the lectures of the best statistics and economics professors in France, he also immersed himself in the Nicholas Georgescu-Roegen (born Nicolae Georgescu, 4 February 1906 – 30 October 1994) was a Romanian mathematician, statistician and economist. A progenitor and a paradigm founder in economics, Georgescu-Roegen's work was decisive for the establishing of ecological economics as an independent academic sub-discipline in economics 9974810ff7

He authored 11 books independently and 5 with co-editors, and made frequent appearances on ABC Radio's Notes on the News program.
