== Sources of law == 5a29ea6d24 The primary law-making body is formed by the Dutch parliament in cooperation with the government, operating jointly to create laws that are commonly referred to as the legislature (Dutch: wetgever). The power to make new laws can be delegated to lower governments or specific organs of the State, but only for a prescribed purpose. A trend in recent years has been for parliament and the government to create "framework laws" and delegate the creation of detailed rules to ministers or lower governments (e.g., a province or municipality). 5a29ea6d24

Hamilton produced what has now become the doctrine of implied powers. Hamilton argued that the sovereign duties of a government implied the right to use means adequate to its ends. Although the United States government was sovereign only as to certain objects, it was impossible to define all the means it should use, because it was impossible for the founders to anticipate all future exigencies. Hamilton noted that the "general welfare clause" and the "necessary and proper clause" gave elasticity to the Constitution. The law established a new Federal Executive Council as the executive organ of government. The constituent republics subsequently adopted matching laws. In 2024, France became the first country to explicitly protect abortion rights in its constitution, while Yugoslavia implicitly inscribed abortion rights in its constitution in 1974. As of 2025, countries that legally allow abortion on request or for socioeconomic reasons comprise about 60% of the

world's population. Such laws range from abortion being freely available on request, to regulation or restrictions of various kinds, to outright prohibition in all circumstances

== Origins ==

Constitution of Alberta the basics of its structure were set out in a statute passed by the federal parliament, the Alberta Act (1905). The office of Attorney-General at one time suggested 23 acts which might be included, but cautioned that this was not a "definitive list". Alberta's constitution, like the United Kingdom's (on which it is modelled), includes any and all pieces of legislation, court decisions, proclamations, and conventions which together inform how the province operates. However, since Alberta is a part of federation, its powers are clearly delineated in law, via the Constitution of Canada. Many statutes are important to understanding the governance of the province, but nowhere are they consolidated into a single document or even a list. As is typical of all Canadian provinces, and Westminster systems more generally, Alberta's is an unwritten constitution.
