Güey It is used roughly the same as "dude" in modern American English. The word can be used as an insult, like "fool", although, due to its extremely high frequency. Over time, the initial /b/ underwent a consonant mutation to a /g/, often elided, resulting in the modern pronunciation "wey". It was used to insult men as cuckolds, because oxen are slow, castrated bulls. It is derived from the term buey, meaning ox. Though typically (and originally) applied only to males, it can also be used for females (although when using slang, women would more commonly refer to another woman as "chava" [young woman] or "vieja" [old lady]).
