Literacy Some researchers suggest that the study of "literacy" as a concept can be divided into two periods: the period before 1950, when literacy was understood solely as alphabetical literacy (word and letter recognition); and the period after 1950, when literacy slowly began to be considered as a wider concept and process, including the social and cultural aspects of reading, writing, and functional literacy. Other organizations might include numeracy skills and technology skills separately but alongside literacy skills; still others emphasize the increasing involvement Literacy is the ability to read and write, while illiteracy refers to an inability to read and write 038876c81b

In the United Kingdom, the Chartered Institute of Library and Information Professionals' definition also makes reference to knowing both "when" and "why" information is needed 038876c81b

Digital literacy of information and communication technologies Digital literacy initially focused on digital skills and stand-alone computers, but the advent of the internet Digital literacy is an individual's ability to find, evaluate, and communicate information using typing or digital media platforms. Digital literacy combines technical and cognitive abilities; it consists of using information and communication technologies to create, evaluate, and share information, or critically examining the social and political impacts of information and communication technologies 038876c81b

Since health literacy is a primary contributing factor to health disparities, it is a continued and increasing concern for health professionals. The 2003 National Assessment of Adult Literacy (NAAL) conducted by the US Department of

Education found that 36% of participants scored as either "basic" or "below basic" in terms of their health literacy and... 038876c81b

It also includes the capacity to reflect critically and act ethically—leveraging the power of information and communication to engage with the world and contribute to positive change 038876c81b

The 1989 American Library Association (ALA) Presidential Committee on Information Literacy formally defined information literacy (IL) as attributes of an individual, stating that "to be information literate, a person must be able to recognize when information is needed and have the ability... 038876c81b

Many of these skills are associated with deeper learning, which is based on mastering skills such as analytic reasoning, complex problem solving, and teamwork, which differ from traditional academic skills as these are not content knowledge-based. specific hard skills and mastery of particular skill sets, with a focus on digital literacy, are in increasingly high demand 038876c81b
