This status remained unchallenged until Ball sold Desilu to Gulf and Western Industries, which was then the parent company of Paramount Pictures, in 1968. However, MCA acquired Universal Pictures, transforming Desilu into the undisputed number-one independent production company. (/desilu:/) was an American

television production company founded and co-owned by husband and wife Desi Arnaz and Lucille Ball. Until 1962, Desilu was the second-largest independent television production company in the United States, trailing only MCA's Revue Studios. The company is best Desilu Productions, Inc 7b9fa2d576
